Jeremiah 20:10-13 ·

‘He has delivered the life of the needy from the hand of evildoers.’

Jeremiah said:

I hear many whispering.

Second reading

Romans 5:12-15 ·

‘The free gift is not like the trespass.’

Brothers and Sisters: Just as sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all sinned — for sin indeed was in the world before the law was given, but sin is not counted where there is no law. Yet death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those whose sinning was not like the transgression of Adam, who was a type of the one who was to come.

But the free gift is not like the trespass. For if many died through one man’s trespass, much more have the grace of God and the free gift by the grace of that one man, Jesus Christ, abounded for many.

Gospel Acclamation

The Spirit of truth will bear witness about me, says the Lord,

and you also will bear witness.

Gospel

Matthew 10:26-33

‘Do not fear those who kill the body.’

At that time: Jesus instructed his Apostles: ‘Have no fear of them, for nothing is covered that will not be revealed, or hidden that will not be known. What I tell you in the dark, say in the light, and what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul.

Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father knowing. But even the hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not, therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows. So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven, but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven.’

BIDDING PRAYERS

PRIEST: In confidence that nothing hidden will remain unknown, and that the Lord who values even the sparrow hears every prayer, we turn to Him with trust:

Response: Lord, hear us.

For the Church, that she may proclaim the Gospel without fear, shining the light of Christ boldly in a world often clouded by doubt and silence, we pray:

Lord, hear us.

For all Christians who suffer rejection, ridicule, or persecution because of their faith, that they may find strength in Christ who confesses them before the Father, we pray:

Lord, hear us.

For leaders of nations, that they may govern with truth, courage, and respect for human dignity, resisting every form of injustice done in secret, we pray:

Lord, hear us.

For those who live in fear—of failure, judgment, or the unknown—that they may hear the Lord’s words, “Do not be afraid,” and find peace in His loving care, we pray:

Lord, hear us.

For our wounded earth, that we may treat creation not with silence or neglect but with reverence and responsibility, protecting forests, waters, and all living things as gifts from God, we pray:

Lord, hear us.

For our local community and families, that our words and actions may confess Christ daily, bringing hope where there is discouragement, we pray:

PRIEST: May the Lord who knows us completely, even before we speak, hear these prayers we make in faith. Amen.

St Joseph’s Building Restoration

At an extraordinary meeting of the Parish Council on Thursday evening, members of the Diocesan Curial Office presented to the Council the results of a condition survey carried out on the church building and presbytery.

Condition surveys are a normal part of building maintenance. The survey has identified significant repairs required of the buildings and the stained glass.

Fuller details will be provided at a Parish meeting on 23rd June at 6.30pm which all are invited and encouraged to attend.

A significant amount of money is required to be raised to carry out the work needed. This will be done primarily through grant funding. Additional fundraising will be required.

The parish will need your support for the project, including the signing of petitions and writing of letters of concern regarding the condition of the building. This petition will be available for signing next Sunday, 21st June and then again at the meeting scheduled for the 23rd.

In the meantime, the services of Heritage Funding Consultant, Maria Jones have been engaged, and grant applications will start immediately. Maria has also been working on the project to restore St Mary’s, Lochee.

Maria’s first task is to seek support for the restoration from additional interested parties such as the University of Dundee, local MP’s, MSPs and Councillors as well as our school, St Joseph’s on Blackness Road.

Maria will submit an ‘Expression of Interest’ to funders which would then be followed by a full application.

Please support this project to restore our beautiful church and help secure its future.
