SOLEMNITY OF SS PETER AND PAUL



The Church today celebrates the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, two very different men united by one faith, one Lord, and one mission. Peter was a simple fisherman who often acted before thinking. Paul was an educated Pharisee who once persecuted Christians. Yet God's grace transformed both into fearless apostles whose witness changed the world.

Peter teaches us that holiness is not about perfection but about trusting Christ after our failures. Though he denied Jesus three times, he repented and became the rock upon which Christ built His Church. Paul reminds us that no one is beyond God's mercy. His dramatic conversion shows that God's grace can change even the hardest heart.

Both apostles gave their lives for Christ in Rome, proving that faith is worth every sacrifice. Their courage challenges us to remain faithful in a world that often rejects Christian values. Like Peter, may we profess that Jesus is the Christ. Like Paul, may we proclaim the Gospel with zeal and conviction. Through their prayers, may we remain steadfast in faith, united in love, and joyful in the mission Christ entrusts to His Church. Amen.

Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles - Mass of the Day •

Liturgical Colour: Red. Year: A(II).

Readings at Mass

First reading

Acts 12:1-11 •

‘Now I am sure that the Lord has rescued me from the hand of Herod.’

In those days: Herod the king laid violent hands on some who belonged to the church. He killed James the brother of John with the sword, and when he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to arrest Peter also. This was during the days of Unleavened Bread. And when he had seized him, he put him in prison, delivering him over to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending after the Passover to bring him out to the people. So Peter was kept in prison, but earnest prayer for him was made to God by the church.

Now when Herod was about to bring him out, on that very night, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains, and sentries before the door were guarding the prison. And behold, an angel of the Lord stood next to him, and a light shone in the cell. He struck Peter on the side and woke him, saying, ‘Get up quickly.’ And the chains fell off his hands. And the angel said to him, ‘Dress yourself and put on your sandals.’ And he did so. And he said to him, ‘Wrap your cloak round you and follow me.’ And he went out and followed him. He did not know that what was being done by the angel was real, but thought he was seeing a vision. When they had passed the first and the second guard, they came to the iron gate leading into the city. It opened for them of its own accord, and they went out and went along one street, and immediately the angel left him. When Peter came to himself, he said, ‘Now I am sure that the Lord has sent his angel and rescued me from the hand of Herod and from all that the Jewish people were expecting.’

I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.’

Celebrant:

United in faith with the Apostles Peter and Paul, let us bring our prayers before God, who strengthens his Church in every age.

1. For the Holy Church:

That the Church, built on the faith of the Apostles Peter and Paul, may remain steadfast in proclaiming the Gospel with courage and fidelity.

Lord, in your mercy: *Hear our prayer.*

2. For the Holy Father, bishops, priests and deacons:

That they may be strengthened by the Holy Spirit to shepherd God’s people with wisdom, humility and love.

Lord, in your mercy: *Hear our prayer.*

3. For world leaders:

That they may work tirelessly for justice, peace and reconciliation among nations, respecting the dignity of every human person.

4. For those who suffer persecution because of their faith:

That, inspired by the courage of Saints Peter and Paul, they may remain faithful to Christ and find strength in God’s unfailing presence.

KNOW YOUR FAITH!

THE GIFT OF THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is one of God’s greatest gifts to His Church. Through it, Christ offers us forgiveness, healing, peace, and the grace to begin anew. Jesus entrusted this ministry to His apostles when He said, “Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them” (John 20:23). Every confession is therefore a personal encounter with the mercy of Christ through the ministry of His priest.

Sometimes, the Church celebrates a penitential service with **general absolution**. This is different from individual confession. General absolution is the collective imparting of absolution to a group of people without individual confession beforehand. However, the Church permits its use only in exceptional circumstances, such as when there is imminent danger of death and there is not enough time for priests to hear individual confessions, or when there is another grave necessity as determined according to the norms of the Church. It is **not** intended as a substitute for the ordinary celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The ordinary and preferred way of celebrating this sacrament is through **individual confession to a priest**, followed by personal absolution. This allows each person to examine his or her conscience honestly, confess sins personally, receive appropriate spiritual counsel, and hear the comforting words of absolution spoken directly by the priest. It is a deeply personal encounter with Christ’s healing mercy.

Even when someone has validly received general absolution, the Church teaches that anyone conscious of grave sin must make an individual sacramental confession as soon as reasonably possible before receiving general absolution again.

Let us never be afraid of the confessional. The priest is not there to condemn but to reconcile. Every sincere confession brings freedom, restores our friendship with God, and strengthens us to live as faithful disciples. May we make regular use of this beautiful sacrament, approaching it with humility, confidence, and gratitude, knowing that God’s mercy is always greater than our sins.
