Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ



Reflection Today, the Church celebrates the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, traditionally known as Corpus Christi**. This feast invites us to reflect deeply on the greatest gift Jesus left to His Church: the Holy Eucharist. At the Last Supper, Jesus took bread and wine and declared, “This is my Body” and “This is my Blood.” He did not leave us merely a symbol or a memory; He gave us His very self. Every time we celebrate the Mass, Christ becomes truly present among us—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. The Eucharist is the sacrament of love and unity. Through Holy Communion, Jesus nourishes our souls, strengthens us against sin, and draws us into a deeper relationship with Him. Just as ordinary food sustains our physical life, the Eucharist sustains our spiritual life. Without this heavenly food, our faith can become weak and our hearts can grow distant from God. This feast also challenges us to become what we receive. If we receive the Body of Christ, we must be the Body of Christ in the world. We are called to show compassion to the lonely, forgiveness to those who hurt us, and generosity to those in need. The Eucharist must transform our lives and shape our actions.

Today, let us renew our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. May we approach the altar with reverence, gratitude, and love, recognizing that here we encounter Christ Himself. Strengthened by this divine gift, may we become living witnesses of His love and instruments of His peace in our families, our parish, and our world. Amen.

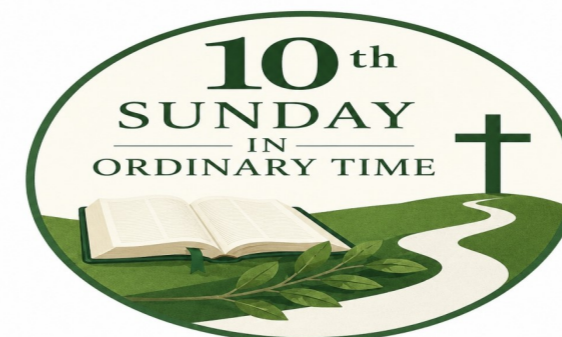

Readings at Mass

First reading

Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a

‘He fed you with manna, which you did not know, nor did your fathers know.’

Moses spoke to the people: You shall remember the whole way that the LORD your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, that he might humble you, testing you to know what was in your heart, whether you would keep his commandments or not. And he humbled you and let you hunger and fed you with manna, which you did not know, nor did your fathers know, that he might make you know that man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD.

Do not forget the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, who led you through the great and terrifying wilderness, with its fiery serpents and scorpions and thirsty ground where there was no water, who brought you water out of the flinty rock, who fed you in the wilderness with manna that your fathers did not know.

John 6:51-58

‘My flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink.’

At that time: Jesus said to the Jews, ‘I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live for ever. And the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh.’

The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, ‘How can this man give us his flesh to eat?’ So Jesus said to them, ‘Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. . For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink . Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood abides in

me, and I in him. As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever feeds on me, he also will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like the bread the fathers ate, and died. Whoever feeds on this bread will live for ever.’

Know Your Faith

The Ten Commandments: God’s Guide for Christian Living

The Ten Commandments are God’s gift to humanity, providing a clear path for living a holy and fulfilling life. Given by God to Moses, they remain as relevant today as they were thousands of years ago. Far from being a list of restrictions, the Commandments are expressions of God’s love, guiding us towards a right relationship with Him and with one another.

The first three Commandments focus on our relationship with God. They call us to worship Him alone, respect His holy name, and keep the Lord’s Day sacred. These commandments remind us that God must be at the centre of our lives.

The remaining seven Commandments concern our relationships with others. They teach us to honour our parents, respect human life, remain faithful in our commitments, respect the property and dignity of others, speak truthfully, and cultivate purity of heart. In a world often marked by selfishness and division, these commandments provide a foundation for justice, peace, and mutual respect.

Jesus did not abolish the Commandments; rather, He deepened their meaning by teaching that true obedience comes from a heart filled with love. As Christians, we are called not merely to follow rules but to live according to God’s love. By faithfully observing the Ten Commandments, we grow closer to God and become better witnesses to Christ in our daily lives.
