PRAYER FOR THE NEW WEEK

Heavenly Father, as I begin this new week, I place myself and my entire family into Your loving hands. Thank You for the gift of life, Your unfailing mercy, and Your constant protection. Go before us in every step we take and fill our hearts with Your peace. Bless our work, studies, ministry, and daily responsibilities with success and purpose. Keep us safe from every danger, sickness, accident, temptation, and evil. Strengthen our faith when we face challenges, and help us to trust You in every circumstance. Fill our home with love, unity, forgiveness, and joy. Grant us wisdom to make good decisions and generous hearts to serve others. May Your Holy Spirit guide our words and actions so that we may glorify You in all we do. We entrust this new week to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.



Today’s readings reveal a God who sees our hunger and responds with compassion. Through Isaiah, God invites us: “Come, all you who are thirsty, come to the water.” God does not merely recognise our needs; he offers himself as the answer to our deepest hunger and thirst. In the Gospel, Jesus withdraws to a lonely place, yet when he sees the crowds, his heart is moved with compassion. The disciples see only five loaves and two fish and think it is not enough. Jesus, however, says, “There is no need for them to go: give them something to eat yourselves.”

This is a powerful challenge to us. We may often look at the problems around us—poverty, hunger, loneliness, injustice and environmental destruction—and think, “What can I possibly do?” Jesus teaches us to offer what we have, however little it may seem. When placed in his hands, our little becomes enough.

Paul reminds us that nothing can separate us from Christ’s love. Therefore, strengthened by that love, let us become people who feed, care, share and protect God’s creation. May we never ask, “What difference can I make?” but rather, “Lord, what do you want me to share?”

When he went ashore he saw a great crowd, and he had compassion on them and healed their sick. Now when it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, ‘This is a desolate place, and the day is now over; send the crowds away to go into the villages and buy food for themselves.’ But Jesus said, ‘They need not go away; you give them something to eat.’ They said to him, ‘We have only five loaves here and two fish.’ And he said, ‘Bring them here to me.’ Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass, and taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven and said a blessing. Then he broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And they all ate and were satisfied. And they took up twelve baskets full of the broken pieces left over. And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.
